In addition, this position will require an ability to adapt to new tools and methods and operate within the complex and dynamic cultural contexts of tribal and urban areas, for example, while maintaining the highest standards of data collection, monitoring/quality control, analysis, and reporting. The ideal candidate will be excited to serve as the face of the organization at relevant meetings and be prepared to travel to assist our clients and present project results throughout the country.

Primary Duties:

- Serve as a vital part of the Big Water team that designs and implements data collection and research projects in tribal, culturally distinct, and underserved communities
- Manage organizational and project resources throughout the entire project lifecycle (conception, planning, implementation, and closeout), track budget and staffing across various projects, create and maintain project workplans and timelines, coordinate work of project staff, and support managers in project design
- Assist with business development and grant writing, including establishing and maintaining relationships with clients and foundations/funding sources
- Engage with senior firm leadership regarding the implementation and health of projects, including reporting through various internal mechanisms
- Collaborate and communicate with clients and partnering organization investigators and research teams regarding project logistics and research goals
- Work with management and business development staff to identify research and evaluation opportunities (often RFPs and grant announcements) in local, state, federal and tribal settings
- Maintain ongoing communication with clients, stakeholders, partners, and institutional review boards before, during and after projects
- Manage project-related paperwork by ensuring all necessary materials are current, properly filed and stored
- Travel (up to 15%) to client offices and lands in rural and remote parts of United States, including Alaska and Hawaii
